Eva Franch is an architect. curator, educator and lecturer of experimental forms of art and architectural practice. Franch specializes in the making of alternative architecture histories and futures. Since 2010, Franch is the Chief Curator and Executive Director of Storefront for Art and Architecture in New York.

Franch is a professor at The Cooper Union School of Architecture and has taught at Columbia University GSAPP, the IUAV University of Venice, SUNY Buffalo, and Rice University School of Architecture. Franch has taught and lectured internationally on art, architecture, and the importance of alternative practices in the construction and understanding of public life at educational and cultural institutions.

Franch has received numerous awards and fellowships, and her work has been exhibited internationally including FAD Biennale, the Vitra Design Museum, and the Shen-zen Architecture Biennale, among others. In 2014 Franch, with the project OfficeUS, was selected by the US State States Pavilion at the XIV Venice Architecture Biennale.

Recent publications by Franch include Agenda (Lars Muller, 2014), Atlas (Lars Muller, 2015), and Manual (Lars Muller 2017) as part of OfficeUS.

Gonzalo Herrero Delicado is an architect and curator of contemporary architecture and design based in London. He is Architecture Programme Curator at Barcelona, the Venice Architecture the Royal Academy of Arts. Trained in architecture in Spain, he worked as an architect for several practices, amongst them Lacaton& Vassal Architectes in Paris. Later, he moved to London where he held Department to represent the United different curatorial positions at The Architecture Foundation and the Design Museum. His curatorial portfolio is composed of a wide range of projects exploring the intersection between architecture, design and art, and their response to contemporary issues. His projects include exhibitions, installations and public programmes developed in partnership with institutions such as the Mies van der Rohe Foundation, Barbican,

Tate, Serpentine Galleries and the ICA. Over the last 10 years, he has widely contributed as a writer to some of the most renowned design and architecture magazines including Domus, Abitare, Neo2, A10, Arguine, Mark and Blueprint.

Architect, landscape architect and graphic designer. founder at Anna Merci -Architecture.

Member of Renzo Piano G124, the senator's working group on italian suburbs. Experienced works on various scales, from temporary installations to urban regeneration, focusing on the interaction between people, architecture and landscape. Postgraduate Degree in Architecture at Università Iuav di Venezia (2008), in 2010 she received her masters degree in Sustainable Urban Design, and in 2013 she won the New Italian Blood Prize, which selects the top



ten young Italian architects in the Landscape section. Since 2008 she has won several national and international competitions (among others, Porto Pool Promenade, Porto 2015 and Venice CityVision, Venice 2011) and has received mentions and awards for its works (among others, Ecoluoghi Urban Regeneration Prize, 2017 and GRAnDe Graphic Design Festival Prize 2018) and the results have been published in various international magazines (among others, Arquine and Domus) and shown in many exhibitions. She has participated in architectural exhibitions including La Triennale di Milano, La Biennale di Architettura di Venezia and WUHO Gallery, Los Angeles. She has been invited to international workshops in collaboration with the Reggio Emilia Landscape Biennale and the FAI (the Italian National Trust). In 2017 she was tutor for Tamassociati (Curatorial team of the Italian Pavilion, Biennale di Venezia 2016) at WAVe 2017 "Syria the making of the Future" organized by Università Iuav di Venezia that focused the attention on post-conflict reconstruction. The project "Same Same but different" won the first prize. She has held lectures at various Universities and cultural events (Mextrópoli Festival de Arquitectura y Ciudad, Università Iuav di Venezia, University of Udine, Order of the Architects of Verona, Pecha Kucha Rome). She has published various articles and she collaborates in Architettiverona magazine. In 2018 she won the Arguine N.20 International Competition for the

MEXTRÓPOLI Pavilion 2018 in Mexico Review, and is a regular voice on City.

James is course coordinator for the European Cultural Academy in Venice and has been a visiting critic or lecturer in architecture at the University of Cambridge, The Bartlett (UCL), the Architectural Association, the CASS, the Strelka Institute, TU Delft, the Berlage Institute, and MIT. He sits on the advisory board of the Future Architecture Platform (Creative Europe).
